Years of Darkness: Sri Vijaya Puram Islanders Endure Multiple Power Cuts Every Day with No End in Sight

Power cuts have been a recurring nightmare for the afloat. residents of Sri Vijaya Puram (formerly Port Blair) and its surrounding areas for the past several years. Despite occasional improvements, the power supply on the South Andaman main island remains unreliable, leaving residents and businesses to cope with frequent outages.

While some residents have adapted to the disruptions by installing backup systems like inverters, these solutions remain out of reach for many. Uppermiddle-class households, with decent earnings, have adjusted to the frequent cuts, using inverters to power essential devices during outages.

island's community, particularly those in the manufacturing and hospitality sectors, the situation is much grimmer. Power cuts have severely impacted productivity and increased operating costs. Businesses in tourism-driven industries like hotels, restaurants, and cafes, which rely heavily on uninterrupted power to serve daily life is a constant struggle, visitors, are forced to rely on

costly diesel generators during outages. These additional expenses have become a significant burden, particularly for small medium-sized enterprises struggling to stay

The issue extends beyond just businesses. Freelancers, remote workers. individual entrepreneurs, and tour operators—all integral to the island's economy—find their daily work disrupted by the constant interruptions in power. The losses, both financial and in terms of productivity, are mounting, impacting nearly every facet of life in South Andaman.

One of the most concerning effects of the power cuts is the non-availability of street lighting. After dark, at any given point of time, some or the other part of Sri Vijaya Puram and more remote locations are often left in complete darkness due to power cuts, raising safety concerns. Repeated power cuts during the evening hours leave streets vulnerable, potentially increasing risk of crime.

Lower-middle-class residents are particularly hard hit, as many cannot afford backup power solutions. For these families, and there appears to be no

immediate solution in sight.

widespread Despite the caused by these disruption power cuts, the Andaman and Nicobar Administration has been unable to find a lasting solution. The issue is far from new; residents have endured unreliable power supply for years, with significant no improvements.

recent past, the the administration has organised high-profile seminars and conferences in cities like Bangkok and New Delhi, where the islands are presented as prime investment destinations, particularly in the tourism sector. However, this raises an important question: how can investor confidence be built when the capital city itself struggles with such fundamental issues? Power reliability is crucial for any business, and the ongoing outages are bound to make potential investors wary of putting their money into a region where even basic infrastructure is unstable. Without addressing the power crisis, the administration's efforts to attract global investors short.

Issues with Cargo Transportation from Chennai to Sri Vijaya **Puram Resolved Following MP's Intervention**

In July and August of this vear residents of the Nicobar Andaman and Islands faced shortages of certain essential commodities due to disruptions in cargo transportation services between Sri Vijaya Puram and Chennai. The local business community grew increasingly concerned as berthing routine arrangements at Chennai Port were affected by a new order issued by Chairperson of the Chennai Port Authority (ChPA).

M/s TCI Seaways, the only shipping company servicing this vital route, experienced delays in early berthing, timely loading, and departure of vessels. These disruptions led to a growing sense of uncertainty among islanders and businesses relying on the steady flow of goods to the islands.

Upon hearing about the issue. the Member of Parliament for the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Bishnu Pada Ray acted swiftly, traveling to Chennai to meet with the Chairperson of Chennai Port Authority. The MP urged the port authorities to address the matter and

prioritise early berthing and loading for Andaman bound cargo ships.

Additionally, the MP penned a detailed letter to Sarbananda Sonowal, the Hon'ble Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, requesting his intervention to resolve the issue. The letter highlighted the urgency of ensuring that TCI Seaways' ships bound for Sri Vijaya Puram are not delayed, as such delays would impact the availability of essential commodities in the islands.

response, Minister Sonowal assured the MP that necessary steps were being taken to prioritise berthing, loading, and departure of cargo ships servicing the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Minister confirmed that the Chennai Port Authority had been instructed to give priority to ships heading to and from the islands. ensurina that essential supplies reach the islands

With this intervention, it is expected that the normal of supply essential commodities to Andaman and Nicobar Islands will continue without disruption, easing the concerns of both the business community and the residents.

has issued a stern advisory to conductors across various State Transport Service (STS) Bus addressing Terminuses, the incidents ticketing


malpractice. The advisorv mentions reports indicating that 2024, highlights that despite some conductors failed to issue tickets to passengers during their duties, contravening prior instructions.

The advisory, dated October 4, previous warnings, the practice continues, prompting Competent Authority to take serious notice of the non-

reiterates that conductors are required to issue tickets immediately upon passengers boarding the bus. In cases where buses are crowded conductors are instructed to safely stop the bus to facilitate ticket issuance

The Directorate has emphasized that adherence to these ticketing protocols is crucial for functioning of the State Transport Service. Any lapses or negligence on the part of the conductors will result in strict disciplinary action, reinforcing importance accountability within the transport system.

Transport officials were urged to circulate the advisory among conductors to ensure complete compliance with the ticket issuance policy.
