Baratang Police Swiftly Arrests Accused in Attempt to Murder Case Within Hours of Crime

а swift response, Baratang Police arrested a 23-year-old man accused of attempting to murder a 17year-old girl within hours of the crime on October 20, 2024. The incident took place near Azad Hind Fauj Setu. Gandhighat Jetty Road, when the accused, enraged by the victim's end their decision to friendship, attacked her with broken glass bottle.

According to the police, a MLC call was received at Kadamtala Police Station, informing them that a minor girl had been seriously assaulted and admitted to PHC Kadamtala. A police team from Kadamtala immediately rushed to the hospital and recorded the victim's statement. revealed that the accused was a friend, a private driver from Flat Bay, Vijaygarh, Baratang, for two years. However, after discovering his alcohol addiction, she end friendship, which led to

arguments. On the morning of the attack, the victim and a female friend took an auto to the meeting spot where the accused was waiting. When she told him she no longer wished to continue their friendship due to his addiction, the accused became violent. In a fit of rage, he attacked the victim with a broken glass bottle, slashing her neck multiple times and inflicting several other injuries as she tried to defend herself. The victim's friend quickly sought help, stopping a passing vehicle, which transported the PHC iniured girl to Kadamtala for urgent medical attention.

victim's Based on the statement, a Zero FIR was registered at Kadamtala Police Station under Section 109(1) of the BNS 2023 and transferred Baratang to Police Station for further investigation, as the crime within occurred its jurisdiction. Subsequently, a regular FIR (No. 37/24) was registered, and the case was assigned to ASI R. Elangovan Baratang Police Station.

A police team, led by SI

Surjit Bhattacharjee and closely supervised by SDPO Rangat, Rahul L. Nair, IPS, launched an intensive search to track down the accused. Within hours, the team successfully apprehended him and recovered the broken glass bottle used in the crime.

The accused has been produced arrested and before the Chief Judicial Magistrate in Mayabunder, where he has been remanded to 14 days of iudicial custody. Investigations also revealed that the accused had been involved in a kidnapping case registered at Diglipur Police Station in 2020 (FIR No. 28/20) and was out on bail at the time of the current offence

Authorities have urged the public to report anv information regarding criminal or illegal activities their nearest police station or via the emergency numbers 100, 112, or 03192-273344. The identity of informants will be kept confidential, and they will be suitably rewarded for credible information.

Islands' Problems Demand IslandCentric Solutions

In the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the routine life of citizens is often disrupted by a crisis in the supply of essential commodities. Particularly acute in the Nicobar Group of Islands, residents frequently face shortages of fuel, cooking gas, and basic food items such as potatoes, onions and tomatoes.

While the recurring shortages are typically attributed to an inadequate number of ships for timely transportation, the underlying issue runs deeper. The real challenge lies in a lack of effective planning and a reactive approach that only kicks in when the situation becomes dire, often spurred by administrative pressure or public protests.

The administration's attempts to implement solutions that have succeeded in mainland India are falling short in the unique context of these isolated islands. What works on the mainland is not necessarily applicable to the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which require tailored strategies that address specific logistical challenges.

The distribution of Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) cylinders, in particular, illustrates the flaws in the current system. Despite efforts by Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) over the past decade to improve distribution by appointing new suppliers, the issue persists in many remote areas.

Before 2003, LPG needs for the islands were met solely through transportation from Chennai and Kolkata. The commissioning of an LPG bottling plant at Hope Town in February 2003 alleviated some supply issues in South

Andaman and surrounding islands, but significant challenges remain.

Addressing the supply crisis requires immediate action to establish bulk LPG storage facilities and small bottling plants on each remote island, as transportation of LPG cylinders has consistently proven to be a challenge, leading to unreliable supply. Bulk LPG carriers can easily replenish supplies to each island based consumption data, with fixed schedules for replenishment tailored to meet demand. These measures are essential, especially as the Government of India conceives mega projects like the Great Nicobar Project, which is expected to significantly increase the islands population. While these initiatives are crucial to meet the immediate needs of the islands, the best long-term solution would be to invest in piped gas supply infrastructure, ensuring a steady and sustainable supply for residents

For the transportation of petrol and diesel, the creation of safe and secure storage facilities on each remote island is essential. Simply refilling petrol station tanks will not suffice; additional storage must be built and regularly replenished according to a fixed schedule to prevent shortages.

Moreover, to support local businesses, cold storage facilities should be developed, and made available at affordable rates for perishable goods.

The entrepreneurial spirit of the island youth can be harnessed to tackle these problems, provided the government allocates adequate funding and relaxes regulations governing the trade and storage of fuels and commodities. While the solutions are within reach, they require concerted effort and a commitment to innovative, island-specific strategies.

CPI(M) Holds 5th Port Blair City Area Conference, Raises Concerns Over Global Conflicts and Local Governance

The 5th Port Blair City Area Conference of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) took place at Shaheed Bhavan, Anarkali, Sri Vijaya Puram on October 20, 2024. The event commenced with the hoisting of the party flag by D. Hemalatha

Secretary of the CPI(M) Port Blair City Area Committee, followed by floral tributes to martyrs

The Conference was inaugurated by D. Ayyappan, Secretary of the CPI(M) Andaman & Nicobar State Organising Committee. In his inaugural address, Ayyappan highlighted the current global crises, expressing concern over

100,000 people since its escalation on October 7, 2023. Ayyappan also referenced the Russia-Ukraine war, stating that the United States is utilizing Ukraine to further its strategic objective weakening and containing Russia.

Reflecting on international political shifts, Avvappan hailed the recent victories of socialist He emphasized the significance of Anura of Sri Lanka, seeing it as a signal that people are seeking alternatives to capitalist systems

On the domestic front, Ayyappan criticized the policies of the third-term Modi government, predicting no shift in its pro-corporate, neoliberal

agencies to target opposition leaders as evidence of the BJP's intent to continue on an authoritarian path. Ayyappan also condemned the government's handling of post-election setbacks, alleging that widespread attacks on minorities and the passage of anti-minority laws in BJP-ruled states followed its recent losses in Parliament

Ayyappan raised alarms about the BJP's "One Nation. One Election" proposal, warning that if implemented, it could undermine the parliamentary democratic system and the federal structure of the country

Shifting focus to local issues, Ayyappan expressed dissatisfaction with the governance of the BJP-led administration in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. He voiced concerns about the ongoing power cuts, deteriorating road conditions, corruption, and the authoritarian and the Administration Governor

and former Secretary of the State Organising Committee, K.G. Das, directed criticism at both the Congress and BJP for their roles in abolishing the Pradesh Council without providing a UT-level democratic setup in the islands. Das also raised concerns about the deteriorating healthcare system in the region, pointing out the lack of life-saving drugs in hospitals run by the Andaman and Nicobar Administration

D. Hemalatha presented the Secretary's report detailing the party's activities and progress in the Port Blair urban area over the past three years. The report sparked an active discussion among participants, leading to the adoption of resolutions on kev

Additionally, senior leader P. Banerjee presented a condolence resolution during the event, while D. Laxman Rao, State Secretariat Member of the CPI(M), also addressed the gathering.
