A & N Islands Set for Major Fisheries Boost: Union Ministers, LG, Officials, and Investors Converge at Swaraj Dweep to Pin Andamans as Shining Star on Global Fisheries Map

The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Dairying, Husbandry organised the "Investors' Meet 2024" on November 14 at Swaraj Dweep, showcasing investment potential in the fisheries and aquaculture sectors of the Andaman & aquaculture Nicobar Islands. Present at the Union Minister event were MoFAH&D Rajiv Ranjan Singh, Minister of State MoFAH&D S.P. Singh Baghel, Minister of MoFAH&D Kurian, and Lt. Governor of A & N Islands Admiral D.K. Joshi. The event also welcomed Secretary (Fisheries) Administration Abhilaksh Likhi and Chief - A & N Islands, Secretary Keshav Chandra, among other officials and industry stakeholders.

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands, with a vast 6 lakh square km Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) abundant in high-value tuna, represent a promising opportunity in the global \$40 billion tuna industry. Although annual yields could reach 60,000 metric tons, current production remains only around 4,420 metric tons, highlighting significant growth potential. The Islands' location near Southeast Asia provides

strategic trade routes by sea and air, priming it as an ideal hub for India's tuna exports.

In this context, the Department of Fisheries, Government of India, under the Pradhan Mantri Matsva Sampada Yojana (PMMSY), initiated development of a Tuna Cluster in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. This project investment emphasises infrastructure, partnerships with investors, training, and capacity-building to enhance operations and improve the global competitiveness of tuna fisheries.

Investors from across India and abroad, including companies from Sri Vijaya Puram, Mumbai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Goa, Mysore, Pune, Visakhapatnam, Kerala, and Thailand, gathered at the Investors' Meet to explore opportunities for business in fisheries and aquaculture in A & N Islands.

At the meet, Union Minister Singh emphasised the government's commitment to transforming the sector through initiatives like PMMSY, PM-MSKY, and the Blue Revolution, supported by an unprecedented 38,572 crore investment since 2015. He highlighted the Government's new target to achieve 1 lakh crore in exports through deepfishing, advanced processing facilities, and



Lt. Governor Joshi announced plans for a comprehensive fisheries policy that would simplify regulations, fast-track project approvals, single-window introduce system to attract private sector investment. He also detailed upcoming facilities, such as fish landing centres, cold chain infrastructure, seafood clusters, processing and offices, dedicated export including MPEDA and EIC, aimed at bolstering local and fisheries alobal trade. Secretary Likhi and Chief Chandra stressed Secretary opportunities in the underutilised marine resources surrounding the Islands, particularly in sea cage culture marine ornamental fisheries. The Chief Secretary highlighted the notification of the A&N Islands as a Tuna Cluster as a strategic move to capture the Islands' economy potential, leveraging its location near key tuna markets such as Thailand and Indonesia

CPI(M) Condemns Unilateral Decision to Impose User Charges of Rs. 1000 for Garbage Collection from Households in SVPMC Area

The Communist Party of India (Marxist) [CPI(M)] has strongly condemned the decision by the Sri Vijaya Puram Municipal Council (SVPMC) to impose a user fee for garbage collection from residents in the municipal area. In a letter addressed to the Secretary of the Municipal Council, dated 14th November 2024, CPI(M) Secretary D. Ayyappan expressed concern over the lack of consultation with stakeholders and residents before announcing the charge.

In his letter, D. Ayyappan referred to the press release issued by the Municipal Council on 12th November 2024, which announced that a user fee of Rs. 1,000 per month would be levied on each household under the Sri Vijaya Puram Municipal Council's Solid Waste (Handling & Management) Bye-Laws, 2017. The CPI(M) has raised several objections, particularly pointing out that the bye-laws were not made available in draft form prior to their finalisation and implementation, thereby bypassing a crucial public consultation process.

Ayyappan highlighted that such a fee would place an undue burden on the already struggling population in the Municipal area. Many residents earn less than Rs. 10,000 per month, and a charge of Rs. 1,000 would be unaffordable

for them. The party argued that imposing such a fee would only exacerbate the financial hardships faced by the urban poor, especially amidst rising prices and unemployment.

The CPI(M) also emphasised that, unlike in the past, many Islanders are now facing increased poverty, making the imposition of such fees an additional hardship. Ayyappan suggested that the issue should be discussed with political parties, social organisations, and prominent local figures before any user fee is imposed.

In conclusion, CPI(M) has urged the Municipal Council to withdraw its decision and engage in consultations with the public and stakeholders. Ayyappan warned that if the Council proceeds without addressing the concerns raised, the party would consider organising an agitation involving the people of the municipal area.


