Elon Musk's Starlink Used by Maritime Smugglers Caught With INR 36,000 Crore (\$4.26 Billion) Methamphetamine in Andaman Waters

In a significant revelation. Elon Musk's satellite internet service, Starlink, has been linked to a massive drug bust in the Andaman Sea. where approximately 6,000 kilograms of methamphetamine were discovered aboard а Myanmarese fishing trawler near Barren Island of the UT of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, India. The Indian Coast Guard vessel intercepted the and apprehended six Myanmarese nationals onboard.

Initial reports indicated that the suspects were in possession of an Inmarsat satellite phone. However, recently, the Director General of Police (DGP) of Andaman and Nicobar Police, Mr. Hargobinder Singh Dhaliwal, informed PTI that investigators also found a Starlink mini dish, along with sim cards from multiple countries, Myanmarese currency. and the previously reported Inmarsat device.

This marks the first instance of smugglers using Starlink's highspeed internet connectivity to navigate remote and rough sea routes in the region. According to the DGP, while Starlink services are unavailable in Myanmar—the fishing trawler's country of origin —they are accessible in nearby regions. Investigators plan to approach SpaceX, Starlink's parent company, to gather details regarding the device's purchase, usage, and activity history.

A Game-Changer in Smuggling Operations

Starlink is a satellite-based broadband service developed by SpaceX, a private aerospace manufacturer and space transportation company founded by Elon Musk in 2002. The service leverages a constellation of low Earth orbit satellites to high-speed internet deliver access, particularly in remote or underserved areas.

Primarily designed to bridge connectivity gaps worldwide. Starlink offers low-latency internet with download speeds suitable real-time for communication and advanced navigation. Its portable hardware, including mini dishes, has now been identified as a tool in facilitating illicit activities in remote maritime regions.

Smuggling Network and Investigation Progress

The fishing trawler, towed to Sri

Vijaya Puram Port, was carrying

Methamphetamine valued at 36,000 crore approximately (USD 4.26 Billion) in the international market. Authorities are investigating the larger smuggling network, focusing on identifying international and regional operatives

The DGP further clarified that the consignment was not intended for delivery in India. However, he added that the smugglers had contacted someone in India and investigation is being conducted to ascertain whether a fraction of the drugs was meant for distribution in India. The Deccan Herald reported this detail, the report was later shared on microblogging platform X (formerly Twitter) by the Andaman and Nicobar Police.

Implications of Technology in Crime

The use of advanced technology such as Starlink underscores the growing sophistication of smuggling operations. This incident highlights the dual-use nature of innovations like satellite internet, capable of transforming global connectivity while posing challenges for law enforcement.

The Andaman and Nicobar Police, in collaboration with other agencies, continues to investigate this high-stakes case. Bishnu Pada Ray Requests Nitin Gadkari to Renew Proposals and Convert Six State Highways of A & N Islands into National Highways

Mr. Bishnu Pada Ray, Member of Parliament (MP) for Andaman & Nicobar Islands in the 18th Lok Sabha, has urged the Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways, Mr. Nitin Gadkari, to revive the long-awaited upgradation of six key State Highways to National Highways (NH).

The push for these road upgrades began during Mr. Ray's earlier tenure in the 16th Lok Sabha (2014-2019), when successfully he secured principal approval for the upgradation of six State Highways in 2017. These roads were seen as crucial for enhancing connectivity and spurring development in the region. In response to his efforts, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) had tasked the Andaman Public Works Department (APWD) with preparing Detailed Proiect Reports (DPRs) for the projects, as outlined in MoRTH's letter NH-14014/187/2015-P&M No. dated 6th July 2017.

The six State Highways earmarked for NH status include: - Jetty Hut Bay to RK Pur and

VK Pur (Little Andaman) – 22 km (SH-1) - Havelock Jetty to Ramnagar

 Havelock Jetty to Ramnagar Beach (Havelock Island) – 11 km (SH-4)
Govindnagar Junction to

Kalapathar (Havelock Island) - 9

km -Neil Jetty to Sitapur (Shaheed Dweep) – 4 km - Kalara Junction to Ramnagar (SH-14, Diglipur) – 20 km - Diglipur Bazaar (NH-4) to Hatilevel (SH-15) – 24.7 km

However, after the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, progress on these projects stalled, and the DPRs were not finalised. The delay in advancing these critical infrastructure projects left local residents, who had hoped for improved connectivity and economic growth, disheartened.

To revive these projects, Mr. Bishnu Pada Ray met Mr. Nitin Gadkari in Parliament on November 28, 2024. During the meeting, he urged the Minister to renew the proposal for the upgradation of the six roads and directed the A&N Administration to expedite the preparation and submission of the DPRs for early approval and execution.

Mr. Gadkari responded swiftly, instructing the concerned Secretary to fast-track the necessary actions for the implementation of these longawaited projects.

Mr. Ray highlighted that the completion of the six NH projects would significantly address the region's infrastructure needs and improve the quality of life for its residents, marking a major milestone for the development of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.





> The program was inaugurated by the Deputy Commissioner of N&MA, Mr.

Dilkhush Meena, IAS, who addressed the gathering of Master Trainers and local fishermen. In his address, Mr. Meena emphasized the importance of transponders in ensuring the safety of fishermen at sea. He praised the efforts of Teias Networks and the Zonal

Fisheries Office for organizing the event and highlighted the vital role of this technology in safeguarding lives.

The session was conducted by Mr. Shrikant Rao, Senior Manager at Tejas Networks, who elaborated on the significance of transponders and their benefits for multiple stakeholders, including the Department of Fisheries, fishermen, boat owners, and maritime agencies. He explained that transponders allow fishermen to send SOS signals in case of emergencies such as medical assistance, fire accidents, engine malfunctions, or manoverboard situations. In turn, maritime agencies can use these devices to send weather alerts, such as warnings about cyclones, heavy rains, or high tides, to fishermen at sea, advising them to move to safer locations.

Key features of the transponders include two-way communication. SOS signals, Potential Fishing Zone (PFZ) data, and weather alerts. A video demonstration on the installation of transponders was also shown to the participants, offering practical insights into the system's application.

The program was coordinated by Mr. Tapan Kr. Biswas, Assistant Director of Fisheries, N&M Andaman District, who expressed his gratitude to the Deputy Commissioner for motivating the participants and ensuring the success of the training

Transport Director Conducts Inspection at Sri Vijaya Puram Bus Terminus

In a bid to improve public transport services, Dr. Jatinder Sohal, Director

of Transport, along with other senior officials, recently conducted an inspection of the Sri Vijaya Puram Bus Terminus to assess the facilities and services available to commuters. The inspection covered key areas such as bus conditions, terminus

infrastructure, parking arrangements, and commuter amenities.


Dr. Sohal reviewed the condition of buses, including their fitness expiry dates, and emphasized the importance of timely inspections and repairs to ensure passenger safety. He also directed officials to maintain cleanliness and hygiene within the buses and the bus terminus, including ensuring good upholstery and proper facilities for commuters such as drinking water and During the visit, the Director addressed concerns about the poor condition of roads within the premises and instructed APWD engineers to expedite roadworks. which are already underway. With the renovation of the canteen building completed, Dr. Sohal also issued for directives its prompt operationalisation, ensuring it serves both daily commuters and employees at the terminus

Engaging directly with commuters, Dr. Sohal listened to their grievances and issued immediate instructions for their resolution. He also took the opportunity to remind bus drivers and conductors about the importance of soft skills and sensitivity towards passengers.

Additionally, Dr. Sohal visited the Central Workshop, where he inspected the repair and maintenance of buses. He stressed that all buses should not only be in perfect working condition but also comply with legal standards.

Similar inspections will be carried out across all the Islands of the Union Territory, with feedback from commuters to be collected and addressed promptly.

A press release issued by the Transport Department confirmed the ongoing commitment to improving public transport services for the benefit of commuters.
