**Defunct Water ATMs Across** Sri Vijaya Puram Highlight Wastage of Public Funds

Water ATMs installed across Sri Vijaya Puram under the ambitious Smart City Project have become glaring wasteful examples of expenditure. Installed at significant public expense, many of these units have remained non-functional for an extended period, raising concerns about their procurement, maintenance, and overall

frustration over mismanagement of funds in Sri Vijaya Puram is palpable, with many pointing to the have been raised about the defunct Water ATMs as a prime example. While these installations were intended to provide affordable drinking water, residents claim the ATMs worked briefly before falling into disrepair. Since they have been then, reduced to little more than an eyesore, occupying public spaces without serving their intended purpose.

issue is not new.

Nicobar Times, in a video story published on 1st March highlighted the widespread dysfunctionality of these Water ATMs. Over 21 months later, the situation remains unchanged.

The installation of these Water ATMs reportedly involved a significant outlay of public funds. Critics argue that the resources spent on this failed project could have been directed towards more impactful initiatives to benefit Sri Vijava Puram's residents.

Public outrage has also fuelled calls for comprehensive investigation into the project. Questions quality of the procured Water ATMs, the transparency of the procurement process, and the contracts awarded for their maintenance. Some allege that corruption may have played a role in the selection of substandard equipment.

Experts and residents alike are urging authorities to assess the quality of the Water ATMs and evaluate

whether the funds spent align with the value received. Additionally, there is a growing demand to identify officers responsible for the project's failure and hold accountable. them

The non-functional Water ATMs should either be repaired and made operational or sold to recover some of the public funds before the equipment becomes entirely obsolete.

As the defunct Water ATMs remain a testament to inefficiency, public anger continues to mount. Authorities are being urged initiate a thorough investigation to uncover the reasons behind the project's collapse, ensure accountability, and prevent similar wasteful expenditures the future.

Sri Vijaya Puram's residents deserve better governance, and restoring public trust will require decisive action to address this glaring failure.

Private buses are a lifeline for thousands of commuters in Sri Puram, Vijaya offering affordable and convenient travel options. upgrades Recent Department have I the STS Bus Transport transformed Terminus in Mohanpura into a comfortable and modern hub. The facility boasts an air-conditioned waiting area, a snack shop, an enquiry counter, a public address system for announcements, a dedicated ATR ticket booking counter, and a bus pass issuance office. These amenities provide passengers with a seamless pleasant experience.

In stark contrast, the private bus stand just a few hundred meters away is in a state of neglect. The only facility available is an open-sided waiting shed, which offers little protection during heavy rains as winds drive water inside. The unpaved surface of the stand riddled with large significant potholes, creates

inconvenience for passengers vehicles

While administration the deserves praise for enhancing the STS Bus Terminus, its apparent disregard for the private bus stand reflects a step-motherly treatment of private operators who play a vital role in the public transport ecosystem.

The private bus stand at Mohanpura should to developed match the standards of the STS Bus Terminus. Modern facilities such as а covered and air-conditioned enclosed waiting area, paved surfaces, and basic passenger amenities are essential to ensure equity convenience and for commuters.

Private bus operators contribute significantly to public transportation. and passengers deserve the same level of infrastructure as those using government services. Upgrading the private bus stand in Mohanpura into a model facility would not only benefit commuters but also demonstrate a commitment to fair treatment for all stakeholders the transportation sector.

The time has come for the administration to address these disparities and provide better facilities at the Mohanpura private bus stand, ensuring a more inclusive and efficient public transport system in Sri Vijaya Puram.



## CPI (M) Secretary Writes to CE APWD to Solve Water Shortage Issue in Middle Andaman Villages

During his recent visit to Middle Andaman, D. Ayyappan, Secretary of the CPI (M) State Organising Committee, engaged with villagers from Bakultala, Urmilapur, and Kaushalyanagar, who raised concerns about the persistent shortage of drinking water in their areas. The villagers pointed out that the water supply in these regions, part of the

Betapur, Urmilapur, and Kaushalyanagar Gram Panchayats, is significantly delayed compared to other parts of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Ayyappan, upon arriving at Sri

Vijaya Puram, addressed the issue by sending a letter to the Chief Engineer of the Andaman Public Works Department (APWD), bringing attention to the situation. While drinking water is typically supplied to residents on alternate days throughout the

islands, the three Gram Panchayats mentioned above receive water only once every three days, creating unnecessary hardship for the local population.

The water supply to these areas comes from a tank at Bakultala which relies on water transported via an ageing pipeline from Panchawati, laid by the APWD several decades ago. According to Ayyappan, the pipeline, which runs through a forested region, suffers from leaks in multiple places, severely affecting the flow water. Furthermore, measures have been taken to protect the pipeline from damage caused by wild animals or miscreants, exacerbating the problem.

Currently, tankers are used to transport water from Panchawati to Bakultala, incurring substantial costs throughout the year. In his letter, Ayyappan criticised the lack of initiative from the authorities in addressing the issue and urged the Chief Engineer to take immediate action.

The CPI (M) Secretary has called for the replacement of the old pipeline with a new one to ensure an adequate and consistent water supply to the residents of Bakultala, Urmilapur, and Kaushalyanagar, alleviating the ongoing hardships faced by the thousands of villagers in these areas.
