HRS Warns of Challenges for Stretcher Patients as Air India Transfers Operations on Sri Vijaya **Puram - Chennai Route to Air India Express**

Hindu Rashtra Shakti (HRS) has raised serious concerns about the transportation of stretcher patients following the recent changes in the Sri Vijaya Puram to Chennai flight service operated by Air India. In a press conference held on 30th December 2024, the organization warned the Government, local administration, and the public about the challenges that Islanders, particularly those requiring stretcher transport, may face in light of Air India's decision to transfer its operations to Air India Express on Sri Vijaya Chennai Route.

In a significant restructuring move, Air India Group announced on 1st October 2024 that it had completed the operational integration and legal merger of its low-cost carriers, Air India Express Ltd and AIX Connect Pvt Ltd (formerly AirAsia India), into a larger low-cost carrier network. This decision later resulted in Air India ceasing its operations on the Sri Vijaya Puram - Chennai route, a vital lifeline for many Islanders who rely on air travel for essential medical care. As a result, Air India Express now handles this crucial route, with significant implications for passengers requiring stretcher

Mr. Anshuman Roy, State Youth President of Hindu Rashtra Shakti, shared grave concerns about the changes, specifically regarding the transportation of stretcher patients from Sri Vijaya Puram to Chennai. Under Air India's previous system, the fixed cost for transporting a stretcher patient was Rs. 2.42.000. While this price was admittedly high, Mr. Roy explained that it provided Islanders with the assurance of a fixed rate.

which was critical for families facing medical emergencies.

Moreover, Air India also had a manual booking process for stretcher patients in addition to the online process, where the airline staff at the local airport would personally assist families in arranging transportation. According to Mr. Roy, this local process was both quick and empathetic. The staff, understanding the urgency of the situation, ensured that the necessary arrangements were made swiftly, often within hours, so patients could be transported by the next available flight to Chennai for further

With Air India Express now managing the route, Mr. Roy outlined several issues that are likely to burden families in need of stretcher transport. Firstly, the cost of transporting a stretcher patient is no longer fixed. Instead, it is subject to fluctuation based on the prevailing price of nine seats on the flight, in addition to other charges. Mr. Roy warned that the new pricing structure could result in costs exceeding the previous Rs. 2,42,000, making it unaffordable for many families, especially in emergency situations.

Furthermore, he highlighted the major change in the booking process. Unlike Air India's manual system, Air India Express requires families to book stretcher transport through an online process, with communication occurring via call centres and email. This online process necessitates a minimum lead time of 72 hours before the flight, which may not be feasible in emergency situations where time is of the essence. Mr. Roy expressed concern that in urgent medical cases, the lack of local support to facilitate the booking process could lead to delays, leaving patients without necessary transportation for critical Chennai.

In light of these challenges, Mr. Roy made ar urgent appeal to the Central Government A&N Administration and local leaders to address the situation. He called for the establishment of a system that allows local booking for stretcher patient transportation at Sri Vijaya Puram, ensuring that this service is available with all airlines operating on the including Air India Express. Additionally, he emphasised the need for a capped cost for stretcher transport to prevent exorbitant prices from becoming a barrier to

Hindu Rashtra Shakti leader also stresse the critical importance of these steps, giver that advanced healthcare facilities are limited in the Islands. Many Islanders rely on transportation to Chennai for surgeries, specialised treatments, and other medical care not available locally. Without a reliable and affordable system for transporting stretcher patients, these Islanders may face unnecessary hardship during health crises.

The transportation of stretcher patients from Sri Vijaya Puram to Chennai is a vital service for the Islanders, and the recent changes in the flight operations have raised alarms about accessibility, affordability, and efficiency. As the situation stands, there is a pressing need for the Central Government, the local administration, and airlines to come together and implement a system that ensures affordable accessible and timely transportation for patients in need of emergency

Hindu Rashtra Shakti has called for immediate intervention, urging all concerned authorities to address these issues and prevent the healthcare and transportation crisis that looms for stretcher patients on the Chennai route Vijaya Puram

First Case of Gold Smuggling **Detected at Veer Savarkar International Airport After Initiation of International Flight Operation**

In the first reported case of Rasool gold smuggling at Veer Savarkar International Airport since the initiation of international flight operations, a resident of Tamil Nadu was apprehended by Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) officers during a random baggage check.

The suspect, Mohd Zunaith Rasool, a resident of Madurai, travelled from Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, to Sri Vijaya Puram aboard the Air Asia flight on Saturday (28 December 2024). His destination final was Chennai, he had a booking on SpiceJet flight scheduled for the same evening from Sri Vijaya Puram Chennai.

CISF selected Rasool for a With the commencement of random baggage scan upon international his entry into the airport for During the inspection, discovered officers а suspicious item concealed in his bag. Upon further examination, they found 203 grams of gold that Rasool

had allegedly smuggled into Sri Vijaya Puram from Kuala Lumpur, intending to carry it Chennai.

was immediately handed over to customs officials for further investigation. Air Asia had launched its international service between Kuala and Sri Lumpur Vijaya Puram on 16 November 2024, and this incident marks the first instance of gold smuggling detected at the airport since the commencement of international flight operation.

Sources revealed that customs officials have registered a case against Rasool, and a sample of the seized material has been sent to a Kolkata laboratory for confirmation. Rasool was later released on bail the same day.



South Andaman Revenue Officials Receive Specialised Training in Marine Pollution Response

In a bid to enhance preparedness and coordination for managing marine pollution, the Revenue Officials of South Andaman underwent specialised training during a one-day Regional Level Pollution Response Exercise organised by the Indian Coast Guard (ICG). The exercise, held near the Science Centre and Jetty area, focused on the vital role that Revenue officials play in responding to marine pollution

incidents.

The event combined both practical demonstrations and theoretical training, providing a comprehensive learning experience for participants. A key feature of the exercise was a hands-on training session aboard the Indian Coast

Guard Ship (ICGS) Vijit, where officials were equipped with the skills and knowledge necessary to handle oil spills and mitigate their environmental impact effectively.

The exercise also showcased the deployment of specialised pollution response equipment, offering

officials valuable exposure to realtime emergency management techniques. Simulated scenarios provided an opportunity for participants to engage with pollution control logistics, underscoring the importance of swift, coordinated action to minimise environmental damage during such incidents.

The day concluded with a detailed briefing on oil spill prevention and preparedness. Experts shared advanced techniques and demonstrated state-of-the-art equipment for oil spill containment and recovery. The session emphasised the critical need for efficient response strategies in marine pollution emergencies.

This collaborative effort, spearheaded by the District Administration, South Andaman, and the Indian Coast Guard, highlights a shared commitment to safeguarding the region's marine environment. For the Revenue officials, the exercise proved to be a pivotal learning experience, reinforcing their role as first responders and enhancing their readiness for future environmental emergencies.

The initiative not only improves operational preparedness but also strengthens inter-agency collaboration and fosters a sense of collective responsibility to protect the ecological integrity of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands' marine ecosystems. Through such efforts, the islands remain better equipped to face environmental challenges effectively.

The session aimed to educate health officials and the general public about the disease. Dr. Palit conducted a refresher training session covering key topics, including TB symptoms, transmission, prevention strategies, and government initiatives such as the Nikshay Poshan Yojana and the role of Nishay Mitras in supporting patients.
