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## HRS Requests Revamping of Street Vendor Licensing System for Empowerment and Economic Growth of Islanders

Mr. Rakeshwar Lall, the State President of Hindu Rashtra Shakti, has submitted a letter to the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, requesting significant changes to the current street vendor license system. The proposed modifications are proposed to prioritise the livelihoods of islanders, stimulate local economic growth, and preserve the unique cultural heritage of the region.

In his letter, Lall outlines four key modifications to the existing system. First, he advocates for reserving street vendor licenses exclusively for island residents. To ensure that only locals benefit from this initiative, the proposal suggests requiring official documents such as a Ration Card, Islander Card, or Local Certificate. This, Lall argues, will guarantee that the economic benefits of the street vendor sector stay within the local community.

Second, the proposal calls for the creation of a user-friendly online platform where island vendors can easily apply for, track, and renew their licenses. This digital approach is aimed at streamlining the process, making it more efficient and accessible to all islanders.

The third proposed change involves the creation of a publicly accessible database or portal to view and verify licensed vendors. Lall stresses that this move will improve transparency and accountability within the system, ensuring that both vendors and the public can easily confirm the legitimacy of street vendors in the region.

Lastly, the proposal includes the requirement of a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the concerned ward councillor before issuing a street vendor license. This step is meant to involve local communities in the decision-making process, ensuring that vendors have the support of the residents in their

designated areas.

Lall emphasized that these changes would not only promote economic growth and self-sufficiency but also preserve the region's cultural identity by ensuring that the street vending sector is controlled by locals rather than external labour. He believes these modifications will lead to improved monitoring, enforcement, and a simpler application and renewal process, further boosting the local economy and ensuring cultural preservation.

The letter concludes with a call for the Lieutenant Governor to consider the proposed changes, urging the implementation of a more inclusive and sustainable street vendor license system that would serve the public interest. The letter has been forwarded to several key officials, including the Member of Parliament, Chief Secretary of A&N Administration, Deputy Commissioner of South Andaman, and local media outlets.

## Anti-Narcotics Police Station Seizes 155 Grams of Ganja from Parcel Received Through Post, One Apprehended

On January 3, 2025, Anti-Narcotics Police Station conducted a successful operation in Sri Vijaya Puram, leading to the seizure of 155 grams of Ganja and the arrest of a 24-Year-Old, Gourab Mridha. The raid, carried out near the Junglighat Post Office, followed a tip-off received by Inspector Pritam Behari, SHO of the Anti-Narcotics Police Station.

Inspector Pritam Behari received credible information about Mridha, a cook at a hotel in Dollygunj, who was expected to receive a parcel containing illicit drugs. The parcel was reportedly sent via Speed Post. Based on this information, a raiding team was formed under the direction of Dy. SP Palak Goel (DANIPS), and they proceeded to the location.

The team, which included Inspector Pritam Behari, SHO, PS Anti-Narcotics, SI Mohd. Rahil Islam, ASI Sanjay Yadav, PC Nanak Singh, PC Ratan

Das, PC Vishal Kumar, PC M. Raja Rao and PC Nandita Mistry, arrived near the post office, Mridha was observed leaving the post office holding a parcel and was stopped by the police near the Registrar of Co-operative Societies office. Upon questioning, Mridha confirmed his identity and was informed of his legal rights.

The police team, after serving a notice under Section 50 of the NDPS Act, proceeded with the search in presence of independent witnesses. Inside the parcel, they discovered two black plastic polythene bags hidden inside a pair of shoes, each containing a dry, leafy substance. The substance, confirmed through a preliminary drug test, tested positive for Ganja. The total weight of the seized drugs was 155 grams.

Following the discovery, the Ganja was sealed and the parcel, along with the shoes, was seized under a formal seizure memo.

Mridha was arrested and charged under Section 20(b)(ii) (A) of the NDPS Act for possession of narcotic drugs.

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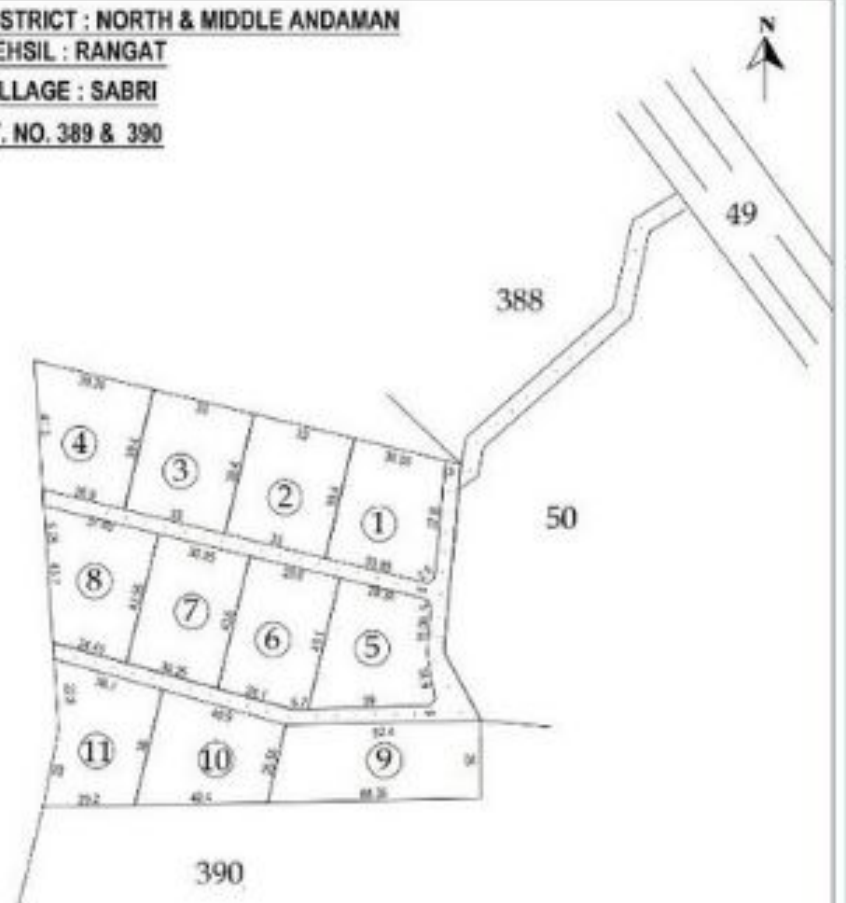
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## Inspiring Celebration of World Braille Day Promotes Inclusivity at GSSS Diglipur

and Consumer Affairs (CS&CA) has extended the deadline for updating e-KYC for left-out Ration Card beneficiaries under the Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) and Priority Households (PHH) categories to January 31, 2025.

Despite repeated requests and extensive efforts, a significant number of beneficiaries are yet to update their e-KYC. The department has urged all AAY and PHH beneficiaries who have not yet completed the process to visit their

nearest Fair Price Shop, the CS&CA Directorate at Sri Vijaya Puram (Room No. 20), or their respective Supply Units in the inter-islands with their Aadhaar numbers to ensure the e-KYC is completed for all members listed on the Ration



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# STA Warns of Crackdown Against Autorickshaws Refusing to Use Fare Meters and Overcharging Passengers



autorickshaw fares via a notification dated January 11, 2023. Following this, autorickshaw drivers were directed to have their fare meters calibrated and stamped in line with the revised rates by the Legal Metrology wing of the Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs. Additionally, drivers were instructed to prominently display the official fare chart in their vehicles.

Passengers must be charged strictly according to the fare meter. Any incidents of overcharging, refusal to operate as per passenger requests, or misconduct by drivers will be dealt with seriously.

The STA encourages the public to report violations such as refusal to use fare meters, excessive fare demands, or refusal to provide service. Complaints should include the autorickshaw's registration number and details of the incident. Reports can be submitted to the Secretary (STA), Directorate of Transport, Sri Vijaya Puram, or through the helpline numbers 03192-240059, 240062, and 230259. Complaints can also be registered with the Traffic Section at 03192-243812.

The STA remains committed to safeguarding passenger rights and ensuring fair practices within the public transport system.

The State Transport Authority (STA) has reiterated its commitment to addressing

complaints about autorickshaw drivers in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands who fail to use fare meters and charge exorbitant fares. The STA emphasized that such practices violate Section 74(2) (viii) and Section 96(xx) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, which mandate the

use of properly calibrated and functional fare meters in autorickshaws and taxis. Despite repeated notices issued through local media, instances of non-compliance persist. The STA has warned autorickshaw permit holders

that repeated violations could lead to the cancellation of permits. Enforcement drives will soon be conducted to ensure strict adherence to permit conditions. The STA, with approval from the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, revised
