Rupa Ray Passes Away at 81; Condolences Pour in From Across Society

In a moment of profound sorrow, Mrs. Rupa Ray, the esteemed wife of Hon'ble Member of Parliament for the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Bishnu Pada Ray, passed away at G.B. Pant Hospital at 4:30 AM on January 7, 2024. She was 81 years old and had been receiving treatment for age-related illnesses over the past six months.

A resident of Round Basti, Dignabad, Mrs. Ray dedicated a significant portion of her life to serving in the A&N Administration, where she worked as an Assistant Secretary before retiring. Known for her kindness, compassion, and dedication to community service, she was a pillar of strength for her husband, Mr. Bishnu Pada Ray, and actively engaged in social work throughout her life. Her approachable nature and willingness to assist those in need made her beloved by many.

Following her passing, her body was first kept at "Praja Niwas," the official residence of the MP, and later briefly at BJP Bhavan, allowing well-wishers, party workers, and members of the community to pay their respects. The final rites of Mrs. Ray were performed at Junglighat cremation ground, where leaders from various political parties, including local citizens and representatives, came together to honour her memory.

Condolence messages have been pouring in from all corners of society, expressing grief and paying tribute to her life of service. Mr. Vishal Jolly, National Executive Member of BJP and Former State President of BJP-ANI, conveyed heartfelt sympathies, stating, "Mrs. Rupa Ray was a remarkable woman who left behind a legacy of compassion and dedication. Historic Drug Bust Case: Court Approves Pre-Trial Disposal of INR 36,000 Crore Methamphetamine Seized by Andaman Police

In the last week of November 2024, news of one of the largest drug busts in Indian history made headlines both nationally and internationally. The Andaman and Nicobar Police seized 6,016.870 kilograms of methamphetamine, worth approximately INR 36,000 crore. The operation began when an Indian Coast Guard Dornier aircraft detected a suspicious fishing vessel near Barren Island. Upon investigation by Indian Coast Guard Ship, the suspicious fishing vessel was found to be loaded with illegal drugs and was subsequently escorted to Sri Vijaya Puram for further examination.

Six Myanmar nationals aboard the vessel—Kyan Lin Khing, Zay Yar Soe, Moe Zar Oo, Htet Myat Aung, Zin Minsoe, and Khin Mg Kyi—were arrested. Currently, the accused are in judicial custody.

Meanwhile, on January 3, 2025, the Special Court (NDPS) in Sri Vijaya Puram granted permission for the pre-

trial disposal of the seized contraband upon a petition filed by the Investigating Officer (IO). According to court records, the contraband, consisting of 222 plastic bags containing methamphetamine, is stored at the Central Storage Room of the CID Unit in Sri Vijaya Puram. The court noted that the procedure of sampling and certification, as mandated by Section 52-A of the NDPS Act, 1985, had already been completed, and chemical samples had been analysed at CFSL Kolkata.

The Special Public Prosecutor emphasised the urgency of disposing of the massive drug haul to prevent theft, mishaps, or further circulation. After reviewing the matter, the court ruled that the petition aligned with the NDPS Act and directed the IO to proceed with the disposal of the contraband in accordance with the law. A certificate confirming the destruction of the seized substances is to be submitted by January 13, 2025.

This landmark drug seizure and its subsequent legal handling have underscored the gravity of the narcotics threat and the vigilance of enforcement agencies in safeguarding society.

Decade-Long Plea for Indoor Sports Hall in Campbell Bay Gains Urgency Amid Rising Drug and Alcohol Abuse Among Youth

The lack of adequate sports infrastructure in Campbell Bay, Great Nicobar, is a pressing concern that continues to hamper the potential of its youth. With the region grappling with the rising menace of drug and alcohol abuse among the younger population, community leaders and residents have renewed calls for the construction of a multipurpose indoor sports hall—a facility that promises to transform the lives of the islanders by fostering both recreational and professional

sports activities.

For over a decade, the youth of Great Nicobar have been advocating for a state-of-the-art indoor sports facility in Campbell Bay. Currently, the island's sports infrastructure is limited to a mini-stadium, which provides an open ground for outdoor sports like cricket, football, and other similar activities. While this stadium serves its purpose during fair weather, the region's unpredictable climate often disrupts outdoor sports, leaving young people without consistent opportunities to stay physically active.

In addition to the mini-

stadium, there exists a substandard gym maintained by Gram Panchayat (GP) Campbell Bay, which suffers from poor maintenance and outdated equipment. Beyond these two facilities, the island lacks any venue for sports, leaving the youth with limited options to pursue fitness or competitive sports during the frequent rainy months.

The demand for a multipurpose indoor sports hall is not new. Plans for such a facility were previously initiated by the Andaman Public Works Department (APWD), which even prepared estimate for the project. However, for reasons unknown, the proposal never materialised, leaving the community's aspirations unfulfilled.

"The recent years have seen a surge in youth going astray due to drug and alcohol abuse in Great Nicobar. It has become increasingly important to provide recreational avenues and channel the energy of our youth in the right direction," said Mr. T. Shiva Raj, General Secretary of the BJP Youth Wing of

Campbell Bay Mandal and an elected Ward Member of GP Campbell Bay.

He highlighted the urgent need for a multipurpose indoor sports hall that would not only offer recreational opportunities but also help aspiring athletes pursue professional sports. "At present, there are no facilities for indoor sports on the island. During most of the year, when it rains, the youth are left with no option to stay physically active," he added.

Mr. T. Shiva Raj emphasized that the proposed sports hall would benefit all sections of society, catering to both casual enthusiasts and those seeking to build a career in sports. He further revealed that a suitable site for the facility already exists near the mini-stadium and the Zonal Library, which had been earmarked for this project earlier. With land availability no longer a hurdle, he urged the Andaman & Nicobar Administration to act swiftly and prioritise the construction of the facility.

In addition to the indoor sports

hall, Mr. T Shiva Raj also called for the inclusion of a 25-meter swimming pool in the project. "Several youth of Great Nicobar are exceptional swimmers. With the right training and daily practice in a proper facility, they have the potential to excel in national and international competitions," he stated.

The construction of a multipurpose indoor sports hall is not just about building infrastructure; it's about nurturing the spirit and aspirations of Great Nicobar's youth. It represents an opportunity to steer them away from harmful distractions and towards a healthier, goal-oriented lifestyle.

The people of Campbell Bay are now looking to the Andaman & Nicobar Administration to take decisive action and fulfil this long-standing demand. With the necessary land and community support already in place, the time to act is now—to ensure that the dreams of Great Nicobar's youth are no longer deferred but transformed into reality.

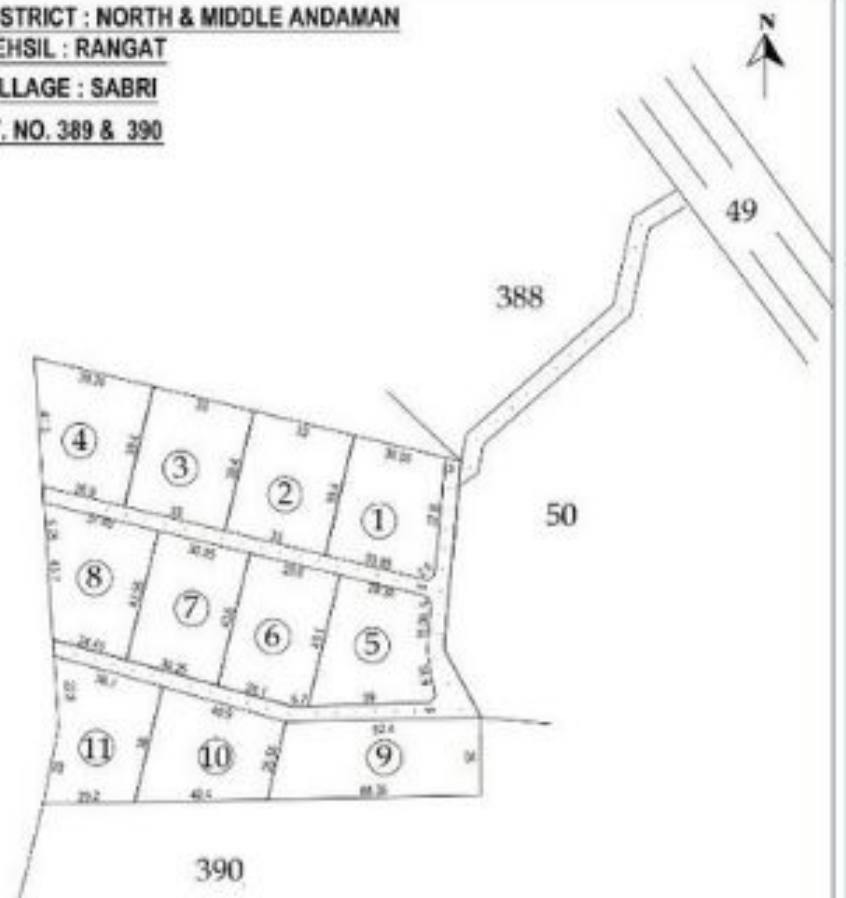
