Andaman and Nicobar State Conference of CPI(M) Calls for Establishment of Legislative Assembly in A & N **Islands on Puducherry Model**

The Andaman and Nicobar State Conference of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) concluded on 29 December 2024, which a resolution passed calling for was the establishment Legislative Assembly for the islands, modelled in line with the setup in Puducherry.

The resolution was sent to the Union Home Secretary in New Delhi by Mr. D. Ayyapan, Secretary of the CPI(M) A & N State Organising Committee. The resolution highlighted the lack continued of democratic framework with a Legislative Assembly for the union territory. resolution pointed out that after years independence, the central government of the largest democracy in the world has failed to provide such a setup to the UT of A & N Islands, unlike other union territories such Puducherry, which has a Legislative Assembly.

CPI(M) also highlighted that previous Pradesh Council, introduced in 1979

the Janata government, was abolished in 1994 by the Congress, leaving the islands without a state-level democratic body. This led to bureaucratic dominance, affecting the development and welfare of local population.

The party noted CPI(M) attempts Members of Parliament in the past to push for the establishment Legislative Assembly have been unsuccessful due to lack of support from both Congress and BJP. current population of the islands exceeds five lakh, further emphasising the need for self-governance.

The State Conference stated that unless Legislative Assembly, similar to the model in Puducherry, is formed, the islanders' issues will remain unresolved. It urged the Government of India to immediately initiate steps to fulfil the islanders' aspirations by establishing the Legislative Assembly.

This resolution comes as part of a broader push for more representation and autonomy the administration of the Andaman Nicobar Islands





These include biodiversity protection plans spanning 30 years for species such as leatherback turtles, corals, longtailed macaques, coconut crabs, megapodes, and crocodiles, as well as a 50-year plan for safeguarding the interests of tribal communities.

Representatives from implementing agencies—including the Wildlife Institute of India, Zoological Survey of India, Botanical Survey of India, Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural History, and Indian Institute of Forest Management—were also present.

The plans prioritise biodiversity conservation, focusing on species diversity and endemism unique to the island and surrounding region. The UT Administration reaffirmed its commitment to protecting and managing these species while ensuring the welfare of tribal communities amid the island's development.

Great Nicobar Island development project aims to balance ecological preservation with sustainable progress, underscoring the Administration's efforts to safeguard both environmental and cultural heritage.


