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First Captain of Pilpillow Village Seeks PM's Intervention for Mobile Connectivity in Village





The Nicobarese tribal community of Pilpillow village on Kamorta Island has expressed frustration over the prolonged delay in the installation of a mobile tower under the Universal Service Obligation Fund (USOF) project. Despite the allocation of land and multiple site visits by officials, no concrete progress has been made, leaving the village without reliable mobile connectivity.

In a recent letter addressed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Mr. Tanveer Hussain, the First Captain of Pilpillow village, highlighted the community's struggle with the absence of mobile network services. The letter stated that the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) had entrusted the project to Reliance Jio as part of an initiative to provide 4G mobile connectivity to uncovered villages and national highways in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

Hussain mentioned that a team from Reliance Jio had conducted a site survey several years ago, followed by a visit from officials of the Department of Telecommunications, Forest, and Revenue Departments for land allocation. In 2023, the local administration had formally allocated the


land for the tower's construction. However, despite these developments, the work has remained stagnant.

The letter states that despite site surveys, soil investigations, and even a recent survey by the Assistant Engineer of the electricity department for power supply, no work has started. Hussain expressed disappointment that Reliance Jio officials have continued to give false hope regarding the project's progress.

According to the letter, the Department of Telecommunications has repeatedly cited a "media issue" as the reason for the delay. Hussain questioned why land was allocated and surveys were conducted if there were unresolved media-related concerns, stating that the delay has resulted in the wastage of government funds.

The residents of Pilpillow village continue to struggle with communication challenges due to the lack of mobile connectivity. The absence of a mobile network affects emergency services, education, and economic opportunities, leaving the community isolated from the rest of the region.

Through his letter, Hussain has urged Prime Minister Modi to intervene and ensure that the promised mobile tower is installed at the earliest. The community now awaits a response from the authorities, hoping for swift action to resolve their long-standing grievance.





Hindu Rashtra Shakti Urges Lt Governor to Install GPS in Government Vehicles to Prevent Misuse





Hindu Rashtra Shakti (Andaman Unit) has submitted a letter to the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor, urging the installation of GPS tracking devices in government-owned and hired vehicles to curb their alleged misuse by officials and their families.

In a formal letter addressed to the Lt Governor, the organisation's State President, Rakeshwar Lall, highlighted concerns over the unauthorised use of government vehicles by officials for personal errands. The letter emphasised that vehicles belonging to various departments, including Social Welfare, Agriculture, Fisheries, Education, and the Secretariat, are frequently seen being used for personal purposes, such as ferrying children to schools and private tuition centres.

Despite the existence of the Andaman and Nicobar Vigilance Department, the effective monitoring and control of such misuse remain inadequate. To address this issue, Hindu Rashtra Shakti has proposed a set of measures:

1. Installation of GPS Devices – Government and Government hired vehicles should be equipped with GPS trackers for real-time monitoring,

ensuring that they are used strictly for official purposes.

- 2. Maintenance of Travel Logs Departments should maintain detailed logs of trips, including destinations, duration, and purpose. Prior approval should be mandated for non-routine trips.
- 3. Data Retention for Audits GPS tracking and travel logs should be stored securely for at least three months to facilitate audits and investigations.
- 4. Strict Penalties for Violations Officials found misusing vehicles should face disciplinary action, including cost recovery measures.

The letter argues that implementing these measures will enhance transparency, prevent resource wastage, and restore public trust in the administration. It calls upon the Lt Governor to take immediate action to enforce stricter regulations on the use of government vehicles.


Copies of the letter have also been forwarded to the Chief Secretary and the Director General of

Police for necessary action, as well as to all print media outlets to raise awareness about the issue.





Real-Time Air Quality Data of Sri Vijaya Puram Now Available on CPCB Portal and Sameer App





The Andaman and Nicobar Pollution Control Committee (ANPCC), under the Department of Science and Technology, has set up a Continuous Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Station (CAAQMS) behind ITF Ground, Junglighat. This facility enables real-time monitoring of critical air quality parameters, including Carbon Monoxide (CO), Sulphur Dioxide (SO₂), Nitrogen Oxides (NOx), Ammonia (NH₃), Ozone (O₃), and particulate matter (PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}), along with meteorological data.

To enhance public awareness, digital display boards have been installed at key locations, providing real-time air quality updates. In a significant technological advancement, the ANPCC has successfully linked the CAAQMS station to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) server in New Delhi, ensuring seamless data transmission and integration into the national air quality monitoring network.

Residents can access real-time air quality data through the CPCB's National Air Quality Index portal (https://airquality.cpcb.gov.in/AQI India/). Moreover, air quality updates, including the Air Quality Index (AQI) and specific pollutant levels, can be viewed via the 'Sameer' app, available on

the Google Play Store. Users can track live air quality updates by selecting 'Sri Vijaya Puram' from the list of monitored locations.

This initiative marks a crucial step towards improving environmental monitoring and public health awareness in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. With real-time access to air quality data, residents can stay informed about pollution levels and take necessary precautions for a healthier living environment.



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

Indian Army Opens Online Applications for Agniveer and Other Categories Recruitment





The Indian Army has commenced online applications for recruitment under various categories for the 2025-26 recruiting year. Aspiring candidates can now submit their applications through the official website, www.joinindianarmy.nic.in. The recruitment notification, published on March 12, 2025, includes vacancies for unmarried male and female candidates under the Agniveer scheme, along with Zonal and Central category enlistments.

Applications are invited from domiciles of 11 districts in Tamil Nadu under the Recruiting Office (Headquarters), Chennai. The districts include Cuddalore, Vellore, Tirupathur, Ranipet, Tiruvannamalai, Chennai, Thiruvallur, Villupuram, Kallakurichi, Kancheepuram, and Chengalpattu, along with Puducherry district of the Puducherry Union Territory and all districts of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

The recruitment will cover several categories, including Agniveer General Duty, Agniveer Technical, Agniveer Clerk/Store Keeper Technical, Agniveer Tradesman (10th Pass), Agniveer Tradesman (8th Pass), Soldier Technical Nursing Assistant, Sepoy Pharma, and Agniveer General

Duty (Women Military Police). Candidates may apply for up to two categories based on their eligibility. The Common Entrance Examination (CEE) will be conducted in 13 languages, including Tamil. Bonus marks will be awarded to ITI and diploma holders, as well as NCC-certified candidates. The application process is exclusively online, and submissions must be completed before the deadline on April 10, 2025.

Admit cards for the online written examination, scheduled for June 2025, will be issued online. Candidates are advised to regularly check the official website and their registered email IDs for updates regarding their admit cards. The Indian Army has emphasized that the recruitment process is fully automated, fair, and transparent. Candidates are strongly advised to beware of touts and fraudulent agents who falsely claim to guarantee selection. The Army has reiterated that only merit, hard work, and preparation will determine selection.



This revision aims to streamline the process of engaging Government and Non-Government Organizations in providing skill training to PwDs, ensuring greater efficiency and transparency in the program's implementation.

Interested Government and Non-Government Organizations are invited to submit an Expression of Interest (EoI) or Project Specific Proposal (PSP) through the PM-DAKSH-DEPwD portal. The training programs must be aligned with the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) and approved by the National Council for

Vocational Education and Training (NCVET).

Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill Conducted at Agriculture Directorate





In adherence to the Chief Secretary's directive mandating quarterly mock drills across all departments of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, the Directorate of Disaster Management conducted an Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill at the Directorate of Agriculture, Sri Vijaya Puram, on Wednesday.

The drill, organized in coordination with the District Administration, A&N Police, Health, and Fire Departments, aimed to assess the Agriculture Department's preparedness for emergency situations.

The exercise commenced at 11 am with a simulated earthquake and fire scenario. Agriculture Department teams swiftly executed safe evacuation procedures, search and rescue operations, and administered first aid to the injured. The communication team promptly alerted key emergency response units, including the State Emergency Operation Center (SEOC-1070), District Emergency Operation Center (DEOC-S/A-1077), and Emergency Response Support System (ERSS-112), alongside Fire, Police, and Health Departments for necessary assistance. Fire tenders and ambulances arrived at the scene,

ensuring timely intervention and medical aid.

A debriefing session was conducted at 11:30 am to review the drill's execution and identify areas for improvement. Officials from the Disaster Management, Police, Fire, District Administration, and Health Departments emphasized the importance of basic disaster management training for Agriculture Department personnel to enhance their response capabilities in real emergencies.

The quarterly mock drills aim to strengthen disaster preparedness and ensure efficient coordination among various departments in times of crisis. (Story Based on PR)



CIARI Conducts Training on Integrated Farming System for Nicobari Farmers in Nancowrie Group





The ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI) conducted a twin programme aimed at improving the livelihoods of Nicobari farmers through the Integrated Farming System (IFS) and Agro-Advisory Services. The initiative, held on March 12 and 13, was organized by the All India Coordinated Research Project (AICRP) on Integrated Farming System in collaboration with Gramin Krishi Mausam Seva and the Zonal Agricultural Office, Nancowrie.

The programme covered four villages—Kakana, Pilpillow, Chotta Enaka, and Hitui—where small agricultural implements were distributed to support farming activities. A total of 195 farmers participated in the awareness-cum-training programme, which focused on sustainable agricultural practices and enhanced farm productivity.

Dr. I. Jaisankar, Senior Scientist (Agroforestry) and Principal Investigator of the AICRP on Integrated Farming System, explained the scope and benefits of the IFS model. He emphasized the integration of tuber crops, fish, poultry, and cattle farming, alongside waste recycling, organic waste management, and integrated pest and disease

control. The use of multipurpose tree species and CIARI technologies was also highlighted as a means to boost farm income.

The event was coordinated by Dr. Abhilash and Mr. T. Harshang Kumar, both Scientists at CIARI; Dr. Santosh Kumar, Head of Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Car Nicobar; and Mr. M.K. Arsad, AFA, Department of Agriculture, Nancowrie.

To aid farmers in their agricultural pursuits, a range of tools and resources were distributed, including 95 axes, 55 hand saws, 102 crowbars, 102 spades with handles, 105 bend knives, 2 garden pruners, and 250 kg of Dweep Bioconsortia.

The initiative was conducted under the guidance of Dr. E.B. Chakurkar, Director, CIARI, as part of the institute's ongoing efforts to enhance sustainable farming practices in the region. (Story Based on PR)

students, and industry stakeholders, making it a significant occasion for the agricultural sector in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.













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
