Dollygunj's Navashakti Nagar Residents Decry Poor Roads and Drainage Despite Regular Property Tax Payments to Municipal Council





Residents of Navashakti Nagar Housing Cooperative Society Ltd., Dollygunj, have raised serious concerns over the poor condition of roads and drainage in their locality. In a formal complaint addressed to the Municipal Councillor of Ward No. 17, the society's president, Mr. Senthil Kumar, highlighted the persistent issues that have plagued the area for over a decade.

The complaint specifically pointed out the deplorable state of Marine Colony Road and the society's internal lanes, which have become hazardous for both motorists and pedestrians.

- 1 Pothole-Ridden Roads: Large potholes have made commuting dangerous, increasing the risk of accidents.
- 2 Uneven Surface: The road's uneven surface has made driving uncomfortable and potentially damaging for vehicles.
- 3 Poor Drainage System: Blocked and inadequate drainage has resulted in frequent waterlogging, leading to mosquito breeding and posing health risks.

Despite multiple complaints over the years and the regular collection of property tax from residents, no significant action has been taken to address these issues. The letter stressed that the tax collected for infrastructure maintenance have not translated into any visible improvements.

"The condition of the roads has deteriorated to such an extent that it has become a daily struggle for residents to commute safely. Waterlogging during rains adds to the misery by creating foul odours and unhygienic conditions," the letter mentioned.

The stagnant water caused by poor drainage has led to an increase in mosquito breeding, raising the threat of vector-borne diseases. Additionally, the unhygienic environment caused by waterlogging and bad odours has become a public health concern.

Expressing frustration over the lack of response despite consistent payment of taxes, the residents have urged the Ward Councillor to take immediate action. They have requested a thorough inspection of the area and the prompt repair of roads, along with a permanent solution to the drainage problem.

The President on behalf of the residents sought urgent intervention to improve the quality of life for residents and ensure public safety.

The residents are hopeful that the municipal authorities will address these pressing concerns and initiate the much-needed repairs without further delay.









Lt. Governor D K Joshi Highlights Major Maritime Projects of A&N Islands at 4th Sagarmala Apex Committee Meeting





Admiral D K Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.), Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Vice-Chairman of the Islands Development Agency, participated as a special invitee in the 4th National Sagarmala Apex Committee (NSAC) meeting held in New Delhi on March 19, 2025. The meeting aimed to strengthen the objectives of Maritime India Vision 2030 and Maritime Amrit Kaal Vision 2047.

During his address, the Lt. Governor highlighted several ambitious maritime projects spearheaded by the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, aimed at transforming the islands into a world-class maritime cluster. He emphasized the upcoming mega projects, including the Ship-Repair and Ship-Construction Hub in the Indo-Pacific region and the International Container Transshipment Terminal (ICTT) at Galathea Bay, which has been notified as a major port. Once operational, the terminal will rank among the top three ports in India, with a handling capacity of 16.5 million TEUs, significantly boosting India's maritime infrastructure.

The Lt. Governor also spoke about the Port Meadows project, which has been notified as the

first Ship-to-Ship (STS) Transshipment and Customs Port in the region, catering to both exports and imports. Additionally, he mentioned the development of a Deep Water Port at Atlanta Bay, which is poised to become one of the top two or three deepwater ports in India, contributing significantly to India's economic growth and supporting the vision of Viksit Bharat as envisioned by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Emphasizing the need for expedited development, the Lt. Governor recommended fast-tracking the repair and reconstruction of jetties across the A&N Islands as part of the first phase. He also urged the timely completion of projects under the Sagarmala scheme to ensure early realization of the maritime goals envisioned for the region.

The Sagarmala Apex Committee plays a crucial role in overseeing and accelerating the implementation of port-led development initiatives, aligning with India's vision of enhancing its maritime capabilities.



Mahila Congress Stages Protest in Sri Vijaya Puram, Demands Immediate Implementation of Women's Reservation Law





The Andaman & Nicobar Mahila Congress Committee, under the directive of Mahila Congress National President Ms. Alka Lamba, organized a protest in Sri Vijaya Puram on Tuesday, demanding the immediate implementation of the 33% women's reservation in the Lok Sabha and State Assemblies.

The protest, led by State Mahila Congress President Ms. Zubaida Begum, witnessed enthusiastic participation from key party leaders and members. The protest march began from Gandhi Bhavan, where a large number of Mahila Congress members raised slogans, expressing strong opposition to the BJP-led Central Government for delaying the implementation of the Women's Reservation Law, despite its passage in Parliament.

Prominent leaders who joined the demonstration included ANTCC President Mr. Rangalal Halder, ANTCC spokespersons, leaders from various frontal organizations, departments, and cells, along with PBMC councillors and PRI members. The march symbolised a collective demand from Mahila leaders and Congress members for immediate action on the long-pending legislation

aimed at enhancing women's representation in legislative bodies.

Addressing the gathering, several political leaders highlighted that the delay in implementing the law amounted to a betrayal of women's rights and aspirations. They urged the Central Government to fulfill its commitment and ensure that women receive their rightful representation in decision-making bodies.

The protest concluded with the passage of a strong resolution, calling on the government to prioritize women's political empowerment and uphold the constitutional promise of gender equality in governance.



Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill
Conducted at Labour
Commissioner's Office





In adherence to the Chief Secretary's directive for quarterly mock drills across all departments, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration, conducted an Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill at the Labour Commissioner's Office, Sri Vijaya Puram, on March 19, 2025. The exercise aimed to assess the emergency preparedness and response capabilities of the department and was carried out under the supervision of Mr. K. Srinivasa Rao, Labour Commissioner, A&N Administration.

Prior to the drill, a Table Top Exercise was held at 10 am in collaboration with the District Administration, A&N Police, Health, and Fire Departments. During the session, officials finalized the earthquake and fire scenarios and assigned roles and responsibilities to the Incident Commander and departmental teams.

The mock drill commenced at 11:05 am, simulating fire and disaster alarms followed by the execution of safe evacuation procedures. Emergency communication was established with the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC – 1070), District Emergency Operation Centre (South Andaman – 1077), and Emergency Response

Support System (ERSS – 112). The response teams efficiently carried out search and rescue operations, provided first aid, and implemented other emergency measures. The Incident Commander declared an 'All Clear' at 11:30 am, signalling the successful conclusion of the exercise.

A debriefing session was conducted post-drill, where the Labour Commissioner commended the active participation of the staff and acknowledged the support extended by the resource departments in ensuring the smooth execution of the exercise. He reiterated the Labour Department's commitment to strengthening its preparedness and response systems to effectively manage disasters in the future.

Little Andaman Forest Division
Organises Biodiversity
Awareness Drive at Nallah Mundi

In an inspiring display of community solidarity and environmental consciousness, the Little Andaman Forest Division organized a comprehensive biodiversity awareness program at Nallah Mundi Beach, Rabindra Nagar, on 19th March 2025. "Community engagement, coupled with robust support from PRIs, can catalyze sustainable conservation initiatives that protect our rich ecological heritage," remarked Mr. Kumar, stressing the importance of grassroots-level efforts.

The program featured a series of interactive sessions aimed at promoting environmental awareness and action. Participants were sensitised to the importance of biodiversity in maintaining ecological balance and human well-being. One of the highlights of the event was the symbolic release of Olive Ridley turtle hatchlings into the sea, signifying hope and commitment toward marine conservation efforts.

Discussions also focused on strategies for peaceful coexistence with wildlife, with emphasis on habitat restoration, conflict mitigation, and responsible waste management to reduce human-wildlife confrontations.

A significant highlight of the program was an intensive beach cleanup drive at Nallah Mundi Beach, where over 50 PRI members and forest staff worked together to remove plastic waste and other debris. This hands-on initiative reflected the community's dedication to maintaining the ecological health of the region.

The event concluded with a renewed pledge from all stakeholders to champion conservation efforts at the grassroots level, reaffirming their

commitment to protecting the fragile biodiversity of Little Andaman.





Awareness Drive on 'PM Vishwakarma' Scheme Conducted Across Car Nicobar Villages





The Extension Office, Industries Department, Car Nicobar, in collaboration with various stakeholders, successfully conducted a series of awareness programmes on the 'PM Vishwakarma' Scheme across all villages of Car Nicobar from February 3 to March 8, 2025. A total of 457 tribal youth and villagers actively participated in the programmes, which aimed to enhance public outreach and provide crucial information about the scheme, especially to those engaged in traditional Nicobari Hodi (canoe) making and mat and basket weaving.

During the sessions, the Industries Promotion Officer, Car Nicobar, explained the benefits of the PM Vishwakarma Scheme, outlining the incentives offered, eligibility criteria, required documentation, and the registration process. He encouraged villagers to enroll based on their respective trades, highlighting how the scheme could significantly improve their socio-economic status and enhance their livelihoods. To ensure the message was fully understood, the Supervisor (Coir), Extension Office, Car Nicobar, presented the information in Nicobarese language, making it easier for participants to grasp the scheme's advantages.

Representatives from the Fisheries Department and Village Level Workers from the Block Development Office, Car Nicobar, also contributed to the awareness drive. The Fisheries Department emphasised the opportunities available in the fisheries sector and elaborated on how the PM Vishwakarma Scheme could benefit those involved in traditional occupations.

Adding to the impact, Village Headmen, Secretaries, and Village Council representatives actively participated by addressing the villagers in Nicobarese and motivating them to take advantage of the scheme's benefits. Pamphlets detailing the PM Vishwakarma Scheme were distributed to all participants, ensuring that the information was widely disseminated across the villages.

The awareness programmes successfully created a platform for empowering local artisans and traditional workers by equipping them with the knowledge and resources needed to enhance their livelihoods through government support.



DIET Garacharama Launches 5-Day 'ICT Integrated Competency-Based Teaching' Workshop





Dr. S.R District Institute of Education and Training (DIET), Garacharama, inaugurated a transformative five-day in-service teacher training workshop on 'ICT Integrated Competency-Based Teaching' on Tuesday, aimed at equipping Primary School Teachers (PSTs) with advanced digital pedagogical tools. The workshop, held at the DIET campus, marked a significant stride toward modernizing classroom practices in alignment with national education goals.

The event was graced by the presence of Mr. Gyan Sheel Dubey, Principal, DIET, while Dr. Sarswati, Lecturer and Faculty In-Charge, presided over the inauguration. In her keynote address, Dr. Sarswati highlighted the importance of adopting ICT-based teaching methods to nurture student competencies aligned with evolving learning needs.

The workshop has drawn 50 enthusiastic PSTs from the South Andaman and Wimberlygunj Educational Zones. Over the next five days, participants will undergo module-based training focusing on key themes such as:

- Integrating ICT Across Subjects: Leveraging

digital tools to enhance teaching-learning processes.

-Promoting Digital Wellness: Educating students on responsible digital behavior and addressing cyber threats.

-Utilizing Government Educational Platforms: Effectively using platforms like DIKSHA, e-Pathshala, and SWAYAM to enrich classroom delivery.

A key highlight of the workshop will be the handson sessions where teachers will create innovative e-content using TAB devices issued by the Education Department. These tablets, distributed to all PSTs, are part of a broader initiative to accelerate ICT adoption in classrooms and bridge the digital divide in education across the islands.


