Residents of Shaheed Dweep are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity.



World TB Day Observed in Car Nicobar, Emphasizing Community Action and Commitment





The World Tuberculosis (TB) Day programme was observed at BJR Hospital, Car Nicobar, with a renewed commitment to eliminate tuberculosis through community participation and sustained efforts. The event, held in the hospital's Conference Hall, brought together key stakeholders, including Mr. Amit Kale, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, Nicobar District, and Mr. Lioneld Nicomed, Chief Captain of the Tribal Council, alongside Tribal Council members, Heads of Departments, medical staff, and community members.

This year's theme, "Yes! We Can End TB – Commit, Invest, Deliver," underscored the importance of united action in eliminating the preventable and treatable disease. The event commenced with the ceremonial lighting of a lamp by Mr. Kale and other dignitaries, symbolizing hope and resilience in the fight against TB.

In his address, Mr. Kale commended the relentless efforts of the District Tuberculosis Officer (DTO), National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP) staff, and ground-level workers for their critical role in TB case detection and management. As a Nikshay Mitra himself, Mr. Kale encouraged

attendees to volunteer as Nikshay Mitras to strengthen community-based support for TB patients.

Mr. Anupam Sircar, Ld. Judicial Magistrate First Class, 2nd Court, Sri Vijaya Puram, who was the chief guest, addressed the gathering and emphasized the importance of safeguarding the legal rights of senior citizens under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents & Senior Citizens Act, 2007. He elaborated on how Elderline 14567 plays a crucial role in providing legal

## Sterilization Camp Benefits 154 Women in Little Andaman





The Directorate of Health Services (DHS), in collaboration with the Union Territory Health Mission (UTHM) and ANIIMS, successfully conducted a fixed-day sterilisation camp at PHC Hutbay, Little Andaman, from March 17 to March 22, 2025. During the six-day camp, a record 154 women from Hutbay, R.K. Pur, and nearby villages availed of laparoscopic sterilisation services, a recognised permanent method of family planning.

The sterilisation team was led by Professor (Dr.) M.K. Saha, Medical Superintendent of GB Pant Hospital, ANIIMS, and Dr. R. Narayanan, Senior Anaesthetist, with strong support from the staff of GB Pant Hospital, Sri Vijaya Puram. Their dedication and expertise enabled the completion of 154 procedures in a remarkably short period.

Dr. Rajni Tiwari, Medical Officer In-charge of PHC Hutbay, and her team played a crucial role by providing essential background support and assistance to the operating team, ensuring the smooth execution of the procedures.

The Director of Health Services also acknowledged the valuable support of the Directorate of Shipping Services for providing the vessel M.V.

Shompen, which facilitated the transportation of the sterilization team and OT equipment, contributing significantly to the success of the camp.





Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill Conducted at Directorate of Tribal Welfare to Assess Disaster Preparedness





In line with the Chief Secretary's directive for quarterly mock drills across all Departments, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration, conducted an Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill on March 24, 2025, at the Directorate of Tribal Welfare, A&N Administration, Sri Vijaya Puram. The exercise aimed to evaluate the disaster preparedness and response capabilities of departmental staff and emergency response teams.

The mock drill began with a Table Top Discussion where officials finalized the drill scenario and assigned roles and responsibilities to department personnel and emergency responders. The drill was initiated at 11:10 am, during which staff followed the 'Duck, Cover & Hold' technique for earthquake safety before evacuating to designated safe zones. Fire alarms were triggered, and communication was swiftly established with the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) (1070), District Emergency Operation Centre (DEOC) (S/A) (1077), Emergency Response Support System (ERSS) (112), and other relevant resource departments.

Search and rescue teams conducted operations to

locate missing individuals, while first aid was provided to the injured. The Fire Tender and ambulance reached the site promptly, ensuring timely response. The exercise concluded with an 'All Clear' signal from the Incident Commander, indicating that the situation was under control.

A debriefing session followed at 11:40 am, where officials from the Directorate of Disaster Management, District Administration, A&N Police, Fire, and Health Departments reviewed the execution of the drill. They lauded the successful coordination and emphasized the importance of regular training to enhance disaster preparedness among staff.

A press release from the Directorate of Disaster Management highlighted that such exercises play a crucial role in improving response efficiency and minimizing risks during real emergencies.







CPI (M) Criticizes BJP Government in Public Meetings at Diglipur and Kalighat





The Communist Party of India (Marxist) [CPI (M)] North Andaman Area Committee organized two public meetings in Diglipur and Kalighat, where the party strongly criticized the BJP-led central government and the local administration for the hardships faced by islanders.

The first meeting was held on March 22, 2025, at Talbagan, Diglipur, and witnessed the participation of hundreds of villagers. The meeting was presided over by Sunil Dutta, while D. Ayyappan, State Secretary of CPI (M), led the charge against the central government. He accused the Modi government of failing to generate employment opportunities for the local youth and alleged that farmers in North Andaman's rural areas were being harassed with eviction notices.

Ayyappan highlighted that these farmers have occupied government land 50-60 years ago, with three generations living and cultivating the land. He alleged that following the 2024 general elections, eviction notices have been served to these farmers, asking them to vacate the land. CPI (M) demanded that the government allot the land to the farmers, recognising their long-standing occupation.

Prominent CPI (M) leaders, including Dilip Karmakar and Banomali Sarkar, State Organising Committee Members, AVA Samad, Secretary of the North Andaman Area Committee, and Paschimsagar Branch Committee Members Nishikant Roy and Nityananda Mistry, were also present at the meeting.

The second meeting took place on March 23, 2025, at Kalighat Bazar. Presided over by Madhan Sarkar, Area Committee Member and Panchayat Member of Kalighat Panchayat, the meeting echoed similar concerns. Ayyappan once again criticized the BJP government, reiterating its failure to address the grievances of the islanders. Dilip Karmakar, AVA Samad, and Bahuram Naik, Kalighat Branch Committee Member, also addressed the gathering.

The CPI (M) vowed to continue its fight against the eviction of farmers and pressed for the immediate allotment of land to those who have been cultivating it for generations. (Story Based on PR)



SFI Forms State Organising Committee in Andaman & Nicobar, Opposes Deemed University





A meeting of students from various educational institutions across the Andaman and Nicobar Islands was held at Sri Vijaya Puram on March 25, 2025. The gathering addressed several issues faced by students in the islands and decided to expand the activities of the Students Federation of India (SFI) across all educational institutions in the region.

The meeting concluded with the formation of a 15-member Andaman & Nicobar State Organising Committee of SFI, with Abdul Warish appointed as the Convener. The newly constituted committee aims to strengthen the presence of SFI in the islands and advocate for student welfare.

A key resolution adopted during the meeting was to oppose the Government of India's decision to disaffiliate all colleges in the islands from Pondicherry Central University and affiliate them with the newly established Deemed University. The resolution highlighted concerns that the move could lead to an increase in student fees, among other challenges. The SFI has vowed to resist what it termed as an "anti-student" decision and pledged to mobilize support against the transition to the Deemed University system.

Prominent speakers at the meeting included D. Ayyappan, Chairman of the JNRM Alumni Association, Aswini P, Executive Committee Member of the Pondicherry University Students Council from Brookshabad Campus, and Abdul Warish.

The Students Federation of India reiterated its commitment to establishing a progressive, democratic, and egalitarian system that ensures social justice and intellectual self-reliance. The organization continues to champion the cause of a universal and free public education system that guarantees education for all, advocating for India's advancement towards a socialist society promoting equality and dignity.

The SFI, which upholds the slogan "Independence, Democracy, and Socialism," reaffirmed its resolve to safeguard the interests of students in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.



Farmers Urged to Contact Electricity Department for Solar Pump Installation Under PM-KUSUM Scheme





The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) has sanctioned 34 stand-alone solar pumps and 436 individual grid-connected solar pumps under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Urja Suraksha evam Utthan Mahabhiyan (PM-KUSUM) scheme for the Andaman and Nicobar Islands for the financial year 2024-25. The scheme, launched in March 2019, aims to reduce diesel dependency in the agricultural sector and boost farmers' income by promoting solar energy adoption.

The scheme will be implemented by the Electricity Department of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, focusing on two key components:

**Component B: Stand-alone Solar Pumps:** 

Under this component, farmers in off-grid areas will receive assistance to install stand-alone solar agricultural pumps or replace existing diesel pumps. Priority will be given to small and marginal farmers, especially those using micro-irrigation systems.

- Pump Capacity: Solar PV capacity in kW will be capped according to the pump capacity in HP, as per MNRE guidelines. For instance, a 3 HP pump

can have a solar capacity of up to 3 kW.

- Financial Assistance: Farmers will receive 50% of the benchmark or tender cost (whichever is lower) as Central Financial Assistance (CFA), with 20% of the cost borne by the farmer through selffinancing or bank loans. Additionally, a 30% subsidy from the Union Territory (UT) Administration is expected to be notified, subject to approval.

Component C: Individual Pump Solarisation (IPS):

This component focuses on solarisation of gridconnected agricultural pumps to ensure reliable day-time solar power for farmers. The initiative aims to incentivize farmers to conserve water by enabling them to sell surplus solar power to the Electricity Department.

- Solar Capacity: Farmers can install solar PV systems with a capacity up to twice that of their pump capacity in kW. This will allow them to meet their irrigation needs while earning additional income from surplus solar power.
- Financial Assistance: Similar to Component B,

50% of the benchmark or tender cost will be provided as CFA. Farmers will contribute 20% of the cost, with the option of self-financing or availing a bank loan. Additionally, a 30% subsidy from the Union Territory (UT) Administration is expected to be notified, subject to approval.

The PM-KUSUM scheme is expected to significantly contribute to the adoption of renewable energy in the islands, reducing carbon emissions and ensuring a sustainable future for the agricultural sector. (Story Based on PR)
