Copper Wire Theft Foiled at NLC Solar Plant in Garacharma; Four Accused Caught, Stolen **Property Worth Rs. 2 Lakh Recovered**

In a swift response by the staff of NLC Solar Power Plant and the police, a theft attempt involving copper wires at the Garacharma-based plant was foiled on Saturday. Four individuals were apprehended for allegedly breaking into the premises of the attempting to steal copper by burning insulated wires connected to the solar panels.

As per the FIR lodged at Pahargaon Police Station, the incident occurred around 11:30 AM when a technician at the NLC Solar Plant noticed a person

burning wires on the premises. The technician immediately alerted the Site Incharge, Mr. M Govinathan, who rushed to the location. Upon reaching the site. Govinathan found that the staff—Sandeen Mondal, Srisanth, Aseem Boroi, Karthick Raia, and Praveen—had detained one of the suspects scene.

Upon asking, the accused revealed PSU-run solar power plant and his identity and named three accomplices. He admitted that the group had entered the plant premises with the intent of stealing copper from the solar panel wires. The accused disclosed that they were burning the wires to extract and sell the copper. This act of mischief resulted in an estimated financial loss of 2 lakh to

According to a post on X by Andaman and Nicobar Police, all four accused have been apprehended, and the stolen property worth approximately Rs. 2 lakh has been recovered.

Murder Reported in Remote Lauki Nallah No. 3 in Billiground; **Neighbour Accused of Killing Kishore Tete**

A murder has been reported from the remote locality of Lauki Nallah No. 3 in Billiground, shaking the otherwise quiet village. According to an FIR lodged at Billiground Police Station, a local resident, Kishore Tete, was found dead in the courtyard of a neighbour's house late on the night of May 6.

The complainant, stated in her report that she and her younger daughter were home when they heard unusual sounds outside around 10 PM. Upon stepping out with a torch, they discovered Kishore Tete lying unconscious, bleeding from the head. Moments later, she saw a neighbour, Alok Sureng, standing nearby in an allegedly intoxicated state. When she confronted him, he reportedly

said, "I have killed Kishore Tete."

Frightened, she called for help from nearby residents. As people began gathering, Alok allegedly fled toward a nearby drain. When the neighbours checked Kishore Tete for signs of life, they found he was no longer breathing.

Due to unavailability of mobile network connectivity in the area, the complainant requested the villagers to anyhow report the incident to the police. The FIR notes that the murder may have occurred following some dispute. The police have registered a case under Section 103(1) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, which deals with murder.

This report is based on the contents of the FIR registered with the Billiground Police Station.

PM-KISAN 20th Installment Likely in June; Govt Launches Nationwide **Campaign to Ensure Farmer Coverage**

four months. The scheme is fully funded by the central government.

As of now, 19 installments have been released, with the latest disbursed on February Prime Minister

Narendra Modi. The 20th installment, covering the April-July 2025 period, is tentatively scheduled for release in June.

Tο receive the upcoming installment, beneficiaries are urged to ensure completion of three key requirements: land record seeding, e-KYC (electronic Know Your Customer), and bank account seeding with Aadhaar. Farmers who fail to complete these steps by May 31, 2025, may face delays or non-receipt of funds.

Farmers who have not yet enrolled in the scheme are encouraged to visit their respective Gram Panchayats during the campaign period with necessary documents. including latest land records, bank passbook, Aadhaar card, and ration card.

For assistance, beneficiaries can contact the nearest Zonal Agriculture Office or field extension staff from the Agriculture Department. Authorities have also advised farmers to use only the official PM-KISAN website and mobile app for self-registration and e-KYC, cautioning against the use of unauthorized third-party applications.
